Cincinnati Mayor Mark Mallory is among eight co-chairs for the Public Library of Cincinnati and Hamilton County's [levy campaign](#). The library is seeking its first-ever property tax levy because of dwindling state revenue.

It's no big surprise that Mallory is cheering the campaign. He worked his way through college at the downtown branch. He was there 14 years in all and has always been a big library supporter.

Other co-chairs are: William J. Moran, senior vice president for Fifth Third Bank; Sarah Anness Evans, Madeira mayor;

H. C. Buck Niehoff, attorney for Peck, Shaffer & Williams; Susan Pichler, volunteer; Ed Rigaud, president/CEO of EnovaPremier; [Gwen L. Robinson, president/CEO of Cincinnati-Hamilton County Community Action Agency](#); Allen Zaring IV, chair of the library foundation.

The 1 mill, 5-year levy would cost the owner of a \$100,000 home about \$30 a year.
